#### **Abstract**

This article examines the structure of Kiswahili Conversation Openings and Conversation Closings (henceforth COs and CCs). The opening phase of the transaction usually consists of a greeting sequence and aims at defining the role of the interactants, establishing the relationship between them, and showing the way the participants set up the turn-taking sequence. The greeting component is important as it facilitates the establishment and sustenance of a cordial relationship between the trader and the customer. The greeting sequence therefore enables the discourse participants to establish a common ground of communication that guarantees the sustenance of the transaction. As is evidenced from the various excerpts cited, the closing section of the transactional exchange also exhibits phatic forms. In this case, the opening as well as the closing sections of this discourse are structured in such a manner that explains the social and discourse structure of the market interactions. It has also established that the COs and CCs are replete with fixed linguistic routines/utterances, which should be considered as being part and parcel of the coherence of the market discourse. In this light, these routine language features which characterise the trader-customer Kiswahili COs and CCs fulfil phatic as well as the communicative function and thus, they are performative in nature.
